Summer is almost here and I want to wish everyone a Safe and Enjoyable Summer.

The budget for 2015 has been finalized and after careful deliberation and discussion it was passed on May 11/15. It has an average increase of 2.3% for Residential Tax and 3.1% for Commercial Tax.

As you know our pool needed a new liner this year or we would not be able to open. After a number of quotes and discussions with companies Council approved a liner costing \$150,000.00 This liner has a 10 year full warranty and is 60 MM thick. Although much more expensive than previously expected, it is the best bang for our buck. The target opening is June 19th!!

Our CAO Ryan Leuzinger and I will be attending the Mayor's Caucus Day on June 17 for communities of 2,500 and less. The main purpose of going is to meet as many of the newly appointed Ministers as possible. This is the government that we must work with for the next four years. The political beliefs that each person holds does not matter because Mayor and Council, must work with and will work with the new government for the best of Milk River. The meeting is being held in Strathmore.

- June 16 - There will be a farewell awards night and supper for our Grade 5 students at 5:30 P.M.

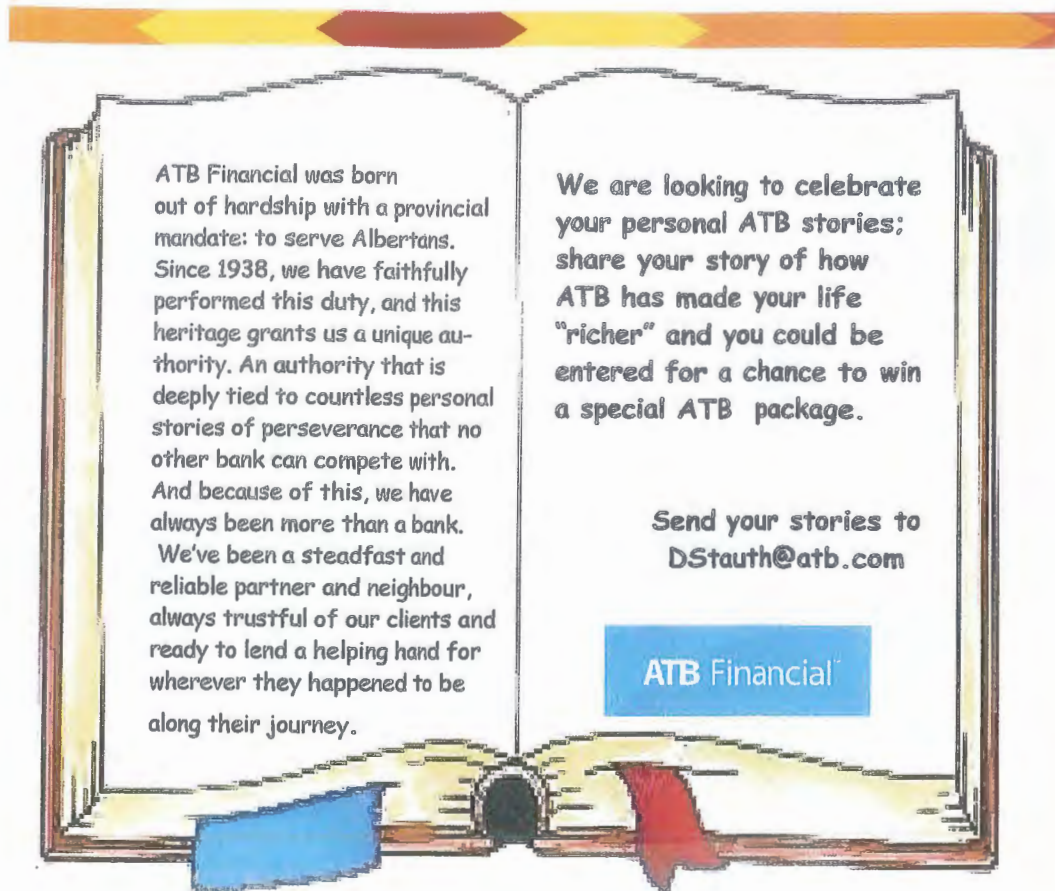
June 17 - Our staff and students will be travelling to Writing-on-Stone for a fun day and picnic at the park.

We are very proud of the diversity of our club, and the community spirit our members exhibit. We help out the Milk River Extended Care facility, support the Highway Clean Up program, participate in events to help our schools, and we host a Community Pancake Supper. We also plant trees at Writing on Stone Provincial Park, and help with the Milk River Community Craft Fair.

Here is a summary of some of the events we do within our project groups:

- Shooting sports project members receive experience from shooting at the New Dayton Rod & Reel Club and the Taber Pistol Club. We attend learning days for gun safety, cleaning & handling.
- Sheep project members attend events with the Lethbridge & Regional Sheep learning day programs & clinics. We host Club Weigh day and Club Clipping day. We host a Judging Workshop. We will be attending the Lethbridge & District Show and Sale in Lethbridge.

- Pheasant project members attend many seminars to improve their flock. We also attend health & animal husbandry classes to learn even more.
- Electrical project members were given guidance by local volunteers through hands on experience and class room knowledge of basic wiring skills & circuits.
